## **REPORTS AND COMMITTEE UPDATES**

### **3. General Manager's Business Progress Report and Update**

- Randy thanked everyone for participating in today's meeting.
- The APPA Legislative Rally will be held in Washington, DC, February 22 – 25, 2026. During this trip Randy will be testifying at the House Natural Resources Subcommittee on Water, Wildlife, and Fisheries for a hearing entitled, *Bureaucratic Delays and Costs to Ratepayers and Electric Power Systems*. He will be representing both APPA and NCPA at the hearing.
- Speaking at the PANC meeting next week in San Francisco.
- The Utility Directors' Retreat will be held in Lodi, March 11 – 13, 2026.
- Capitol Day was held on January 26, 2026 in downtown Sacramento. Feedback has been very positive regarding this event.

### **4. Executive Committee**

Chair Sheppard reported the Executive Committee met prior to the Commission meeting today. A quorum of the Committee was established. The Committee met in Closed Session today and on February 12 to finalize the long list of candidates regarding the Executive Recruitment. First round interviews will start on March 5, 2026. The next regular Executive Committee meeting is scheduled for March 26, 2026.

### **5. Facilities Committee**

Power Management Assistant General Manager Tony Zimmer reported the Facilities Committee met on February 4, 2026. A quorum of the Committee was established. During that meeting the Committee discussed items 14, 15, and 19 – 21 on the Consent Calendar. The Committee was supportive of the above mentioned items. A Special Joint Facilities and Finance Committee meeting was also held on February 11, 2026, to discuss the FY 2027 budget. The next Facilities Committee meeting will be held on March 4, 2026.

### **6. Finance Committee**

Administrative Services Assistant General Manager Monty Hanks reported that the Finance Committee met on February 10 and reviewed Item 13 on the Consent Calendar. The Committee recommended this for acceptance. The Committee also reviewed the financials related to Item 23 and concluded that there were no issues to report to the Commission. A Special Joint Facilities and Finance Committee meeting was also held on February 11, 2026, to discuss the FY 2027 budget. No action was taken at this meeting. The next meeting of the Finance Committee will be held on May 5, 2026.

### **7. Legal Committee**

General Counsel Jane Luckhardt reported the Legal Committee met on February 5, 2026. During the meeting Closed Session items were discussed. The next Legal Committee meeting is scheduled on March 5, 2026.

### **8. Legislative & Regulatory Affairs Committee**

Chair David Hagele thanked everyone for attending today's meeting. The NCPA L&R Committee met yesterday to conduct its annual budget workshop and voted to recommend approval by the NCPA Commission. The Committee also approved several contracts advanced by the NCPA Customer Programs member working groups, and heard updates on the state and federal policy issues NCPA is engaged in.

Several Members and NCPA Staff will be attending the APPA Legislative Rally in Washington, DC next week. We'll be meeting with our delegation to lay the groundwork for our meetings with Members of Congress when we're in DC for the NCPA/NWPPA Federal Policy Conference in April. NCPA has been asked to testify again in Congress on Tuesday during the rally. The House Natural Resources Subcommittee on Water, Wildlife, and Fisheries will be holding a hearing entitled, *Bureaucratic Delays and Costs to Ratepayers and Electric Power Systems*. Randy will be testifying in the hearing, which focuses primarily on barriers to wildfire mitigation by utilities. He will be representing both APPA and NCPA. Registration for the NCPA/NWPPA Federal Policy Conference, which will be held in Washington, DC on April 26-30, will be available soon.

The next regular meeting of the NCPA L&R Committee will be held on August 26, 2026 at NCPA's Roseville office.

**Fiscal Impact:** Upon execution, this amendment will increase the not to exceed amount from \$630,150 to \$1,230,150 over a 3-year term and a not to exceed amount of \$1,070,150 to \$2,070,150 over a 5-year term.

**Fiscal Impact:** Costs associated with entering into the WAPA 2026 REC Program Letter of Agreement 26- SNR-03369 are estimated to be less than \$10,000 for the term of the agreement, and will be allocated according to Base Resource percentages of the represented Members. NCPA's administrative costs for development and administration of the agreement will be allocated to Members in accordance with approved cost allocation methodologies as described in the NCPA annual budget.

**20. Resolution 26-12, Nexant Cost Allocation Model Update for Fiscal Year 2027** – adopt resolution by all members approving the updated Nexant Cost Allocation Model determinants as inputs into the Nexant Power Management Cost Allocation Model in order to allocate budgeted costs to members for Fiscal Year 2027.

**Fiscal Impact:** The annually updated Nexant determinants will result in a change to all members' allocated shares of Power Management costs in varying amounts. Table 1 of Appendix A provides indicative changes in allocated Nexant Power Management costs to members based on current Fiscal Year 2026 budget after applying updated Calendar Year 2025 determinants to the model.

**21. **Fiscal Impact:** The total cost to renew the Casualty Insurance program is estimated not to exceed \$2,772,000 (\$2,540,000 NCPA and \$232,000 LEC). This amount is already included in the Risk Management budget; no budget augmentation is required.

**22. Resolution 26-20, Authorize Teleconference Participation by Commissioners under California Government Code Section 54953.8.7** – adopt resolution by all members authorizing teleconference participation by commissioners under California Government Code § 54953.8.7. **Fiscal Impact:** This report has no direct fiscal impact to the Agency.

General Counsel Jane Luckhardt provided background information regarding changes to the Brown Act due to Senate Bill (SB) 707. Additional requirements for teleconferencing under “just cause” and multi-jurisdictional bodies will now apply to NCPA.

The Ralph M. Brown Act generally requires meetings of legislative bodies to be open and public and historically requires that teleconference locations be publicly noticed and accessible. SB 707 modernized these requirements and established a separate teleconferencing framework for eligible multijurisdictional bodies, including joint powers authorities such as NCPA. Government Code § 54953.8.7 allows a commissioner of an eligible multijurisdictional body to participate remotely from a location that is not identified on the meeting agenda and not open to the public, provided specified statutory conditions are met. NCPA may use this statutory authority if the Commission adopts a resolution allowing it to do so. Jane reviewed and discussed requirements for remote participation under Government Code § 54953.8.7. There was no further discussion


**NEW BUSINESS**
