- Attended Governor Newsom's signing ceremony for bills on climate and energy affordability in San Francisco on September 19, 2025.
- Staff is keeping an eye on the possible government shutdown.
- Attending and speaking at the FERC Wildfire Risk Mitigation Technical Conference on October 21, 2025 in Washington, DC.
- Randy enjoyed a wonderful vacation in Iceland, Greenland, and Northern Canada.

#### 4. Executive Committee

Chair Sheppard reported the Executive Committee met prior to the Commission meeting today. A quorum of the Committee was established. The General Manager and General Counsel provided updates during the meeting. The next regular Executive Committee meeting is scheduled for October 23, 2025. A Special Executive Committee meeting will be held on October 2, 2025.

#### 5. Facilities Committee

Power Management Assistant General Manager, Tony Zimmer, reported the Facilities Committee met on September 3, 2025. A quorum of the Committee was established. During that meeting the Committee discussed items 12 – 17, on the Consent Calendar and items 20 and 24 under Discussion/Action. The Committee also met for a Special meeting on September 16, 2025. A quorum of the Committee was established. During that meeting the Committee discussed item 22 under Discussion/Action. The Committee was supportive of the above mentioned items at both meetings. The next Facilities Committee meeting will be held on October 1, 2025.

#### 6. Finance Committee

Administrative Services Assistant General Manager, Monty Hanks reported that the Finance Committee has not met since the last Commission meeting. The next meeting of the Finance Committee will be on held October 14, 2025.

#### 7. Legal Committee

General Counsel Jane Luckhardt reported the Legal Committee met this past Wednesday, September 24, 2025. During the meeting possibilities were discussed regarding federal preemption.

#### 8. Legislative & Regulatory Affairs Committee

Chair David Hagele thanked everyone for attending the 2025 NCPA Annual Conference and especially to those Members who played key roles in moderating panels and introducing speakers. Timely issues with policy implications for the agency and Members were discussed. As well as an opportunity to connect with many of the stakeholders who NCPA and Members work closely with to advance shared policy goals. Next year's conference which will be held at Everline in Lake Tahoe on September 23-25, 2026

The state legislative session adjourned on September 13, 2025. All of NCPA's key legislative priorities were addressed and advanced this year. These priorities include 1) Passage of the Pathways Initiative to pave the way for California's participation in a regional market without problematic language that was initially included related to governance; 2) Reauthorization of the Cap and Trade program without negative impacts on the availability and use of utility allowances; and 3) Approval of NCPA's bill to extend provisions that provide flexibility in the use of large hydropower resources under the Renewables Portfolio Standard. Legislation was also passed related to wildfires that reduced utility reporting requirements in this area to once every four years.

The next meeting of the NCPA L&R Committee will be held on December 3, 2025 at NCPA's Roseville office.

#### 9. Members' Announcements & Meeting Reporting

NCPA Commissioner Pauline Roccicci, City of Roseville, announced the city will be repowering the Roseville Power Plant # 2 with two new generators. The city has offered NCPA first chance on any spare parts from the old generators. The older generators are 40 years old.

  Fiscal Impact: Upon execution, the total cost of the agreement is not to exceed \$5,000,000 over five years.

  Fiscal Impact: Upon execution, the total cost of the agreement is not to exceed \$3,000,000 over five years.
- 16. Resolution 25-109, Gannett Fleming, Inc. First Amendment to Five Year Multi-Task Professional Services Agreement; Applicable to the following: All NCPA Facilities, NCPA Members, SCPPA, and SCPPA Members – adopt resolution by all

members authorizing the General Manager or his designee to enter into a First Amendment to the Multi-Task Professional Services Agreement with Gannett Fleming, Inc. for professional engineering services, with any non-substantial changes recommended and approved by the NCPA General Counsel, changing the vendor name to GFT Infrastructure, Inc. and amending Exhibit B, with no change to the contract term, for continued use at any facilities owned and/or operated by NCPA, NCPA Members, by SCPPA and SCPPA Members.

**Fiscal Impact:** Upon execution, the total cost of the agreement will remain unchanged at \$2,500,000.

  Fiscal Impact: Upon execution, the Second Amendment to the Multi-Task Consulting Services Agreement will increase the term from five to six years. It will also amend Exhibit B Compensation Schedule and Hourly Fees.

19. Resolution 25-102, Authorizing the General Manager of NCPA to Execute Confirmation Number 0366 for Cooperative Response Center, Inc. Services to the City of Lodi/Lodi Electric Utility and Issue a Corresponding Purchase Order Under the Support Services Program Agreement (SSPA) – adopt resolution by all Members subject to the approval of by the Lodi City Council of the requested services under the terms of the SSPA the Commission of NCPA authorizes the NCPA General Manager or his designee to execute Confirmation Number 0366, with any non-substantial changes as approved by the NCPA General Counsel, and issue a corresponding Purchase Order to Cooperative Response Center, Inc. for answering services 24/7/365 and energy dispatch services for the City of Lodi/Lodi Electric Utility.

**Fiscal Impact:** There is no fiscal impact to NCPA. The services provided by Cooperative Response Center, Inc. to Lodi will be billed to and paid by Lodi pursuant to the terms of the SSPA. NCPA's administrative costs will be reimbursed by Lodi.

Fiscal Impact: Since this item was not previously requested in the FY26 budget, a Budget Change of \$1,000,000 is being requested. The total cost for the CT1 Facilities Inventory Parts Purchase is anticipated not to exceed \$1,000,000. The budgetary funds to complete the work include \$1,000,000 of pre-collected funds in the Maintenance Reserve.

**Motion:** A motion was made by Doug Crane and seconded by Pauline Roccucci recommending the Commission adopt Resolution 25-110 authorizing the CT1 Facilities Inventory Parts Purchase from the City of Roseville CT1 Project and delegate authority to the General Manager or his designee to award bids, execute agreements, and issue purchase orders for this work in accordance with NCPA purchasing policies and procedures, without further approval by the Commission, for a total cost not to exceed \$1,000,000, to be funded from Maintenance Reserve. **Fiscal Impact**: The total cost for the project is anticipated not to exceed \$300,000; this cost includes contingency funds. Funding for the project will come from the FY 2026 Geothermal Budget.
