Resolution No. 15-67, Approve Declaring a State of Emergency at the NCPA Geothermal Generating Project No. 3 in Respect of the Valley Fire; Authorizing the Execution of the APPA Form Mutual Aid Agreement and the Calling for Mutual Aid from Public Utilities; Authorizing NCPA to Become a Member of the California Utilities Emergency Association; Authorizing the General Manager to Enter into Agreements for the Restoration of Services and Operations at the Geothermal Generating Project, including the without Complying with Competitive Bidding Requirements; and Waiving the General Manager Purchasing Authority Limitation – adopt resolution by all members authorizing General Manager to Declare a State of Emergency at the NCPA Geothermal Generating Project No. 3 in Respect of the Valley Fire: Authorizing the Execution of the APPA Form Mutual Aid Agreement and the Calling for Mutual Aid from Public Utilities; Authorizing NCPA to Become a Member of the California Utilities Emergency Association: Authorizing the General Manager to Enter into Agreements for the Restoration of Services and Operations at the Geothermal Generating Project, including the without Complying with Competitive Bidding Requirements; and Waiving the General Manager Purchasing Authority Limitation. Fiscal Impact: Total cost of executing the mutual aid agreements is de minimis. Actual costs of repairs will not be available until crews are able to complete damage assessments that will be undertaken pursuant to the mutual aid agreements. Staff will provide updates on repair costs once the damage assessments are completed, and in any event, plans to seek any insurance and disaster recovery funds that are available to help fund the recovery effort. Environmental Impact: Action is exempt from CEQA as a response to a declared state of emergency.
- 4. Waiver of Personnel Rules Relating to Donation of Vacation Leave to Geothermal Employees Affected by the Valley Fire, and if Necessary, Those Hydroelectric Employees Impacted by the Butte Fire.
