MONTHLY REPORTS

4. Operational Reports for December 2022

Ryan Johnson presented the Operational Report for December. There were no OSHA recordable accidents, no NERC/WECC or permit violations, and no forced outages. The outage schedule was reviewed: the January 2023 outage was cancelled. There were no changes to the Spring Outage schedule.

The operational report reflected monthly production of 191,226 MWH, 690 service hours, and equivalent operating availability of 100%. The report set for the Capacity Factor @ 302MW Pmax of 85%. There were 6 hot starts, 2 warm starts, and no cold starts during the month.

5. <u>Market Data Report for December 2022</u>

Bob Caracristi presented the operating and financial settlement results for the month. LEC was committed to CAISO 31 out of 31 available days. Most startups were for long -term runs, with twenty-three 24-hour runs in the month of December.

6. <u>Monthly Asset Report</u>

Rafael Santana presented the monthly asset report for November 2022. Rafael reviewed the monthly historical comparisons as well as the 12-month history. November 2023 was the best November in the history of the plant, as shown in the Historical Margins graphs.

7. Bidding Strategies Report

Ken Goeke presented the Bidding Strategies Report for December 2022. Ken reviewed bidding and calculating net start-up costs. Ken reviewed DA and RT net revenues over the month with the Committee.

INFORMATIONAL ITEMS

12. End of Governor Gavin Newsom's Emergency Declaration

Jane Luckhardt reviewed the Special Provisions grated under the Governor's current COVID Emergency Declaration which had allowed the LEC PPC to conduct its meetings remotely. The Governor intends to end the Emergency Declaration at the end of February. While the February LEC PPC meeting can be conducted remotely, beginning in March, the LEC PPC will need to revert back to the old Brown Act Rules of noticing all meeting locations on the Agenda.

13. Additional Operational Updates

Rafael Santana provided some clarification that the switch repair which was originally scheduled for the now-cancelled January 2023 Outage, would be completed as a part of the upcoming Spring 2023 Outage (along with all other work previously scheduled for the January Outage). Rafael also noted that vibration issues within the unit have ceased, and the plan is to continue operating the unit under the reduced rate until the Spring Outage.
