First Amendment to the Multi-Task Consulting Services Agreement with D&R International, Ltd. for Electrification Education and Outreach Services (Action Item)—Staff is seeking a recommendation for the NCPA Commission to approve a First Amendment to the existing Multi-Task Consulting Services Agreement with D&R International, Ltd. to extend the agreement expiration date from January 31, 2024 to January 31, 2026, to increase the total not-to-exceed amount by \$1,000,000, for a not-to-exceed amount of \$2,000,000, and to update the Scope of Services and Compensation Schedule. Work completed by this consultant will be billed to the individual member as a Support Services charge under NCPA's Support Services Agreement. (Action Item Commission Category: Consent)

NewGen Strategies and Solutions, LLC First Amendment MTCSA—Staff is seeking a recommendation for Commission approval of a First Amendment to the Multi-Task Consulting Services Agreement with NewGen Strategies and Solutions, LLC for rate design consulting services, to increase the not-to-exceed amount from \$250,000 to \$1,500,000, to ensure sufficient funds are available for the remainder of the contract term, for continued use at all facilities owned and/or operated by NCPA, NCPA Members, by SCPPA, and SCPPA Members.
