Multi-task Consulting Services Agreement with Kanner and Associates for Federal Legislative and Regulatory Advocacy (Action Item)—Staff is seeking a recommendation for the NCPA Commission to approve a Multi-Task Consulting Services Agreement for a one-year term with a right to renew for up to two additional years with Kanner and Associates for federal legislative and regulatory advocacy for a not-to-exceed amount of up to \$300,000 for use by NCPA.
